

Sundeep took up the issue with the then chief minister of Maharashtra, Manohar Joshi, who was very responsive and it is believed that the usage of 'differently abled' will shortly be employed by the government.

Besides this he felt that there should be a strong network amongst the social organisations themselves, and a step in this direction was, seven years ago he arranged a meeting for them in Mumbai. More than a 100 of them used this opportunity to bring to light and sort out their long-standing problems. With

His aggressive campaigns against the use of plastic bag, encouraging use of paper bags, medical camps, aids awareness programme, blindness programme, blindness programme, ECG and stress management camp for the cops in Navi Mumbai are some of his many activities. Sundeep has drawn a blue print of social activities with NMMC.
