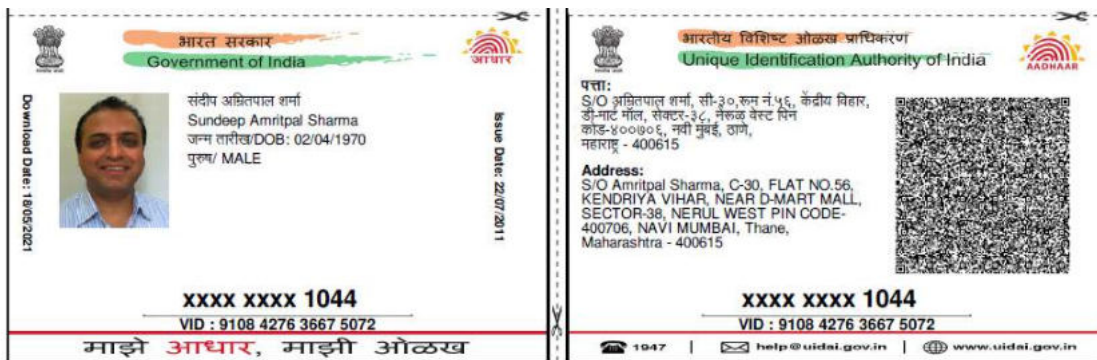

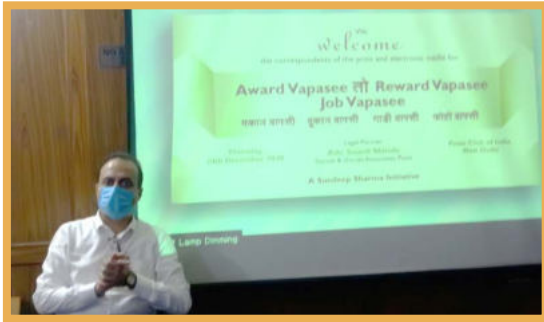

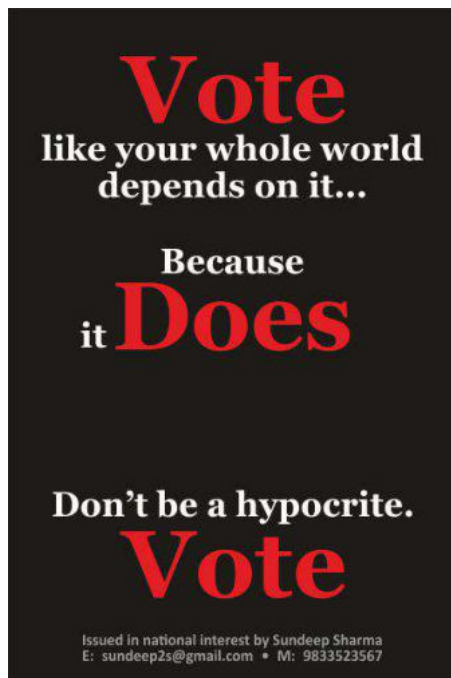

## This Baisakhi Marks 100 Yrs Of Massacre

It will be precisely 100 years within a week of the horrid day in history when Reginald H Dyer had ordered 'Fire' to his troops at the Jallianwala Bagh, killing hundreds of innocents and changing the course of India's freedom movement. While a formal apology for this massacre is still awaited, many city gurudwaras have announced that special 'Ardas' (prayers) will be held for the Jallianwala Bagh victims this Baisakhi.

"The story of Jallianwala Bagh is etched permanently in our hearts," said secretary (estate & finance) of the Dadar-based Sri Guru Singh Sabha Mumbai, Ram Singh Rathor. "When I think of it, I visualize the guns aimed at unarmed civilians, many of whom had just gathered there as part of Baisakhi celebrations, after visiting the Golden Temple nearby. I remember the well in which so many had jumped to escape Dyer's 303 bullets. So, in the absence of any apology from the British, it is better to have a special Ardas at our Dadar gurudwara on the centenary of the Amritsar massacre."

Incidentally, Rathor runs a family business of modifying vehicles in order to make them 'bullet proof' for their clients. "I was inspired to get into the business of designing armoured vehicles after the 26/11 terrorist attacks in Mumbai. That too was an attack on innocent people just like the Jallianwala Bagh incident," he said.

The joint secretary of the Vashi Gurudwara in Navi Mumbai, Tejinder Singh, told TOI: "Our gurudwara vice president, Amrik Singh, and other senior members have also decided to hold Ardas for the Jallianwala Bagh victims in all

the 11 Navi Mumbai gurudwaras to mark the centenary of the tragedy."

When asked if he is also awaiting for an apology from the UK government a hundred years on, Tejinder Singh said: "A mere 'sorry' is too short a word and a sentiment for the massive crime against humanity which took place at Jallianwala Bagh on April 13, 1919. Such a thing must never occur again in India or elsewhere, which is why the spe-

cial prayers."

City-based social activist Sundeep Sharma is researching for a book about the Partition titled 'To the Generation that Forgot, From the Generation that Couldn't'. "We should remember Jallianwala Bagh not for how the British killed us, but how we tend to forget about this war crime," Sharma said. "The centenary of the Amritsar Massacre is therefore an important point of connection with our past, so that we can secure a future," he added.

For Amritsar-based Sunil Kapoor, chairperson of

the Jallianwala Bagh Freedom Fighters Foundation the centenary triggers something personal. "My great grandfather, Mr Vaso Mal Kapoor, had died in the firing ordered by Dyer. His wife, Ms Purn Devi Kapoor, had rushed to Jallianwala Bagh and spent the entire night in pitch darkness there, because no arrangement was made to get the bodies out. Many more, like my great grandmother (Puran Devi Kapoor), had to spend that tragic night at Jallianwala Bagh amidst the dead and those injured," recalled Kapoor, who urged the state and central governments to start providing the due pension to the kin of the victims, as per the Swatantra Satnik Sanman Pension Scheme of 1960. He recently gave a fresh letter to the Punjab minister (freedom fighters welfare) Om Parkash Soni, to remind the state about the pending pensions.

Another Amritsar resident Surinder Kochhar—a historian who in 2014 had made the shocking discovery of a well in Ajnala from where skeletons of 282 Indian soldiers killed during the 1857 uprising were unearthed, stated that the fear of another mutiny was very much on the minds of the British during 1919. "That is why Dyer thought it fitting to kill so many at Jallianwala Bagh in order to quell any imagined rebellion."

## We need more Aadhaar centres in city: Residents

**NAVI MUMBAI:** While the government has made Aadhaar card mandatory for availing various welfare programmes and school admissions among others, residents from Kharghar, Vashi and other areas have complained that there are not enough Aadhaar centres.

Kharghar has only three Unique Identification Authority of India (UIDAI) centres, which are already overburdened.

What is troubling residents most is that Aadhaar card is a must for school admission. The admission process has started and parents have still not been able to get the 12-digit unique identification number of their kids.

Initially, there were many temporary Aadhaar card centers in Kharghar. Some of them were shut, while the rest three were shifted to banks. These centres issue 10-15 coupons daily for appointments. To secure an appointment, people start queuing up at the centres at 4am.

There is only one Aadhaar centre between Belapur and Vashi, which is also overcrowded. Sandeep Sharma, social entrepreneur and Vashi resident, said "Earlier there were many temporary centres, but they have been shut. Now, we have to struggle to find one. This is a failure on the part of the central government, especially at a time when it has made the card mandatory for almost everything."

"I don't know who I should complain to," he said.

"What is more annoying is the cap on the number of appointments. People come to the centre at 4am. There should have been more centres," said Rutuja Harshe, 32, resident of sector 9 in Kharghar.

The admission under Right to Education (RTE) too would begin shortly and Aadhaar card is mandatory.

To get the card people are even taking leave from their offices.

"I have a six-month-old daughter and wanted to open a

savings account for her. When I enquired about the same at the bank, I was told that Aadhaar card of the baby is a must. I could not get any appointment, I am completely clueless now," said Dilip Vaita, resident of sector 5.

## Poll workers' rates shoot up this election

### NOT ALL THAT EASY

With all major political parties going it alone this Assembly election, not only have there been dramatic developments off the field, on the field too, candidates are finding it increasingly difficult to get campaigners to work for them daily on a payroll basis.

One of the reasons is that this time, there are nearly 50 per cent more candidates in the fray all over the state. Thus, the demand for poll workers across parties has

shot up and consequently, the workers' rates too have gone up.

A poll campaign manager of a prominent Congress candidate in the Mumbai suburbs said, "Yes, it is true that we are falling short of poll workers on a daily basis and we are hiring a few of them at 50 per cent higher rates than those during the Lok Sabha elections. Not only this, we have to pay them in advance for the next day without fail."

The Lok Sabha elections had major parties contesting as part of coalitions

with only six seats in Mumbai and 116 candidates in the fray. By contrast,

there are over 500 candidates contesting the Assembly elections. "This is the time for the Election Commission to rethink the cap fixed on expenditure, considering everything has gone up including inflation," said socio-political activist Sundeep Sharma. "As this time the election is being fought separately by all parties, every candidate is uncertain about his/her fate, so no one is taking chances."

So far as the poll workers' rates are concerned, those

campaigning on foot are getting ₹600 to ₹800 while motorcyclists with pillion riders are getting ₹1,500 for both shifts.

Not only daily workers, campaigners set to ride their bikes in rallies have also increased their wage rates. "For the first shift in the morning, I campaign for a different party with my bike and during the second shift, I canvass for another party which gives me ₹1,500 apart from petrol, lunch and dinner," said Siraj Ahmad, a Vikhroli resident.

## 'We hope Uddhav will resolve Shivaji Park row'

Mumbai: The impasse over the makeshift memorial to Bal Thackeray at Shivaji Park continues as the Shiv Sena has refused to remove the structure. "The Shiv Sena was granted permission for the specific purpose of holding Thackeray's cremation. We expected the party to remove the temporary structure on its own after the rituals got over. But now the Sena is pressing for Thackeray's memorial at the same spot. We hope Sena executive president Uddhav Thackeray will step in to resolve the matter," a senior bureaucrat told TOI on Saturday.

Meanwhile, high-ranking bureaucrats from the BMC and the police brass reportedly briefed the chief minister on the row and the possibility of a law-and-order situation on December 6, when lakhs of people are expected to converge at the park to mark Dr B R Ambedkar's death anniversary. "We also briefed the home minister on the matter. The situation appears to be beyond the control of the bureaucracy and law-enforcing agencies. Political intervention is required," he said.

The official said the civic body had invoked provisions of the BMC Act, on an application by mayor Sunil Prabhu and Sena MP Sanjay Raut, to

### Shivaji Park residents want to engage Sena in talks to end memorial wrangle

Residents of Shivaji Park are keen on talks with the Shiv Sena to end the row over a memorial to Bal Thackeray. Matoshree is reportedly gauging the public mood in Dadar.

A section in the Sena feels the party should honour the residents' sentiments and give up its demand. However, others think that Shivaji Park, where the Sena was born in 1966, is part of the party's iconography and that Matoshree should use the park to perpetuate the late Sena supremo's memory. Meanwhile, Sena CEO Uddhav Thackeray has planned a 13-day tour of Maharashtra from Monday. —Ambarish Mishra

# And now, it's your vote that will count

## Mumbai South

Home turf for corporate czars and Mantralaya bosses, this upper crust constituency will see a triangular fight between Jaywantiben Mehta (BJP), Milind Deora (Congress) and Amin Solkar (Samajwadi Party). The SP has played spoilsport in earlier elections by taking away votes from the Congress, to the benefit of the BJP—in the 1999 polls, Congress veteran Murlidhar Deora, Milind's father, lost to Mehta largely because the SP's candidate snatched away a good part of the Muslim vote. Twenty-seven-year-old Milind, a Boston graduate, has put up a spirited fight against Mehta and is counting on young voters as well as the well-heeled minorities in his backyard to see him through this election.

## Mumbai South-Central

Currently undergoing a social and economic transformation from mills to malls, this constituency has seen a lot of action with the entry of big 'daddy' of the underworld Arun Gawli, who has spared neither money nor muscle in his bid to wrest the Lok Sabha seat from Shiv Sena's Mohan Rawle. The don's political ambition has been sought to be stymied by none other than his 32-year-old nephew, Sachin Ahir of the NCP, who has ironically clambered up the political ladder with help from none other than his uncle. Retired IPS officer T.K. Chowdhary, who is contesting on an SP ticket, has joined the melee to make this a four-cornered fight. Although Rawle is likely to benefit from the confusion, the Sena's traditional vote-banks in Chinchpokli, Mazagaon and Parel-Lalbaug may throw their weight behind Gawli. Ahir, who is also president of the RMMS, the NCP-controlled trade union, is banking on mill hands and Muslim voters to turn the tide in his favour.

## Mumbai North-Central

A hotch-potch of Dalit, Muslim, Christian and Hindu voters and a glaring class chasm are evident in this constituency, flanked by the sprawling slums of Dharavi and Nehru Nagar on one side and the

high-rises of Dadar-Mahim on the other. Former Lok Sabha speaker Manohar Joshi is locked in a straight fight with Eknath Gaikwad of the Congress. Although punters claim that Gaikwad is no match for Joshi, the ground reality appears to be somewhat at variance. Gaikwad is a Dalit and the area has a formidable Dalit population of about two lakhs. Also, there are 40,000 Muslim voters who may back the Congress. Shrewd Deshastha Brahmin that Joshi is, he had unleashed a charm offensive on

charge that he has spent more time on Yuvak Pratishthan, a private trust floated by him, than on party activity. Kamat's calculations may go awry because of Raja Dhale, Bharatiya Republican Party-Bahujan Mahasangh nominee and prominent Dalit leader, who unexpectedly shifted his constituency from Mumbai north-central to north-east at the eleventh hour.

## Mumbai North-West

One is a filmstar-turned-politician with unblemished credentials as

north Indian. His campaign against the sale of the Centaur Hotel in Santa Cruz has riled powerful lobby groups, which he claims have campaigned actively against him. Dutt, on the other hand, has steered away from controversy but is known to have kept a low profile in parliament. The actor may have the edge, but it is BSP's Ismail Makwana who threatens to complicate the situation by drawing strong support in the Muslim pockets.

## Mumbai North

This is perhaps the most closely watched of the six Mumbai constituencies, since the adversaries are five-time Lok Sabha member Ram Naik (BJP), currently petroleum minister, and actor Govinda (Congress), a surprise entrant. Naik is hardselling his long years in public life and his record in upgrading the suburban railway network, improving the area's water supply facilities and boosting employment opportunities, while Govinda is banking on the voters' fatigue factor with the incumbent to come to his rescue. The Congress is basing its electoral calculations on the support of the north Indian community, which Govinda enjoys, and on the Sena's apparent reservations about Naik's candidature. In addition, the actor has been assured support by Virar MLA and former TADA detenu Hitendra Thakur; whose brother Bhai Thakur, is the local don.

## Thane

It was once dominated by the BJP. But the Shiv Sena, led by its strongman, the late Anand Dighe, gate-crashed into this constituency a few years ago and consolidated its position. Despite the BJP's insistence, the Sena has not conceded this seat to its ally. With the BJP reconciling itself to its marginalisation, the NCP led by its local leaders Vasant Davkhare and Jitendra Avhad are trying to end the Sena's domination over this constituency which has several industries. Davkhare, a former newspaper delivery boy, is taking on the Sena's sitting MP Prakash Paranjpe.

Whoever captures the largest share of the sizeable slum vote in this constituency from among the Dalit-Muslim dominated segments of Kurla, Chembur and Trombay, is likely to emerge the winner. Congress candidate Gurudas Kamat—also the Mumbai Congress chief—who represented this constituency in 1984, 1994 and 1998, has run a feisty campaign on what he describes as the lacklustre record of sitting BJP MP Kirit Somaiya. Somaiya, who is seeking re-election, is facing an uphill task even in BJP strongholds like Ghatkopar and Mulund, with many local party activists complaining of neglect. They

a peace activist, the other is a journalist-turned-politician who is the 'enfant terrible' of the Shiv Sena. Veteran Congressman Sunil Dutt, who is seeking re-election for a fifth term in the Lok Sabha, will meet his match in Sanjay Nirupam of the Shiv Sena in this constituency. While Nirupam has proved quite effective in his battle for minority hearts, he has had to struggle in overcoming the Sena's image as anti-

men who were on bandobast duty on New Year's Eve.

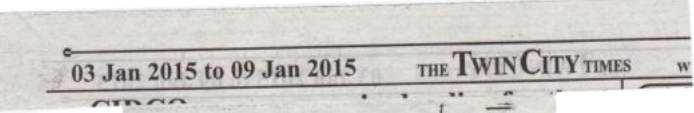
