## Spl security panel for Commonwealth Youth Games

State govt's move comes after intelligence reports warn of terror threat to athletes

Based on specific intelligence inputs, the state government has set up a special committee to ensure safety of athletes participating in the third Commonwealth Youth Games to be held in Pune in from October 12 to 18 this year.

The decision was taken after the intelligence agency in its report said that as high profile national and international athletes were expected to participate in the event, there was a possibility of terrorist organisations targeting the event, said a senior official from the home department.

The committee would be headed by the principal secretary home (special) and assisted by senior officials from the home department, police and the state CID.

The official added that alarmed with increasing terrorist activity and threats across the globe, the state government had geared up its machinery to deal with possible threats during the event. The committee has also been entrusted with the responsibility of arranging security equipment and making arrangements for conducting the event, the official added.

Approximately 1,300 athletes from 71 Commonwealth nations are expected to participate in the event.

"Since the event is of international standard, the government is not taking any chances and is making every effort to arrange for the best security cover," deputy chief minister and home minister RR Patil told DNA. The police have a foolproof plan for the security in place for the event, he added.

### All in the games

- The idea of youth games was discussed in 1997 and approved in 1998
- The event is held every four years
- First Commonwealth Youth Games were held in August 2000 at Edinburgh, Scotland
- 733 athletes from 14 countries participated in the event
- Second Commonwealth Youth Games were held Bendigo, Australia in 2004
- Over 1,000 athletes from 22 nations participated
- Individuals aged 18 years or less are eligible to participate in the event
- Approximately 1,300 athletes from 71 countries are expected to participate this year
